## FAMILY FRIENDLY EVENT FOLLOW-UP TO SCHOOLS SERIES

An opportunity for children attending the LOC schools series to follow up their orienteering with their families.

## ENSURING BEGINNER ACCESS TO LOC EVENTS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR Working alongside Fixtures Group

Consideration of Which areas are suitable for adding beginners courses (alternate With technical areas). Availability of meet-and-greet people. Accessibility of start area.

## CONTINUING PRESENCE ON SOCIAL MEDIA AND LOCAL PRESS

Keeping up-to-date
Sharing news, celebrations, event details,...
Promoting to a Wide audience

## SUMMER HOLIDAYS VIRTUAL ORIENTEERING CHALLENGE

Prepare a family challenge. Could include virtual orienteering alongside an existing permanent course so there is something visual to help.

## DEVELOP LINKS WITH JUNIOR TRAINING PATHWAYS

Having a more joined up approach. For example, sharing of areas and activities amongst different groups.

## LINKING ORIENTEERING TO OTHER LOCAL EVENTS

Opportunities to catch the eye of participants in similar sports. Perhaps an activity following a ParkRun event or at Kendal Mountain Festival. Orienteering at local festivals.

### DEVELOPING LOCAL PERMANENT COURSES AND VIRTUAL COURSES

Consulting With eg. National Trust, Kendal Conservation Volunteers to develop and use permanent and virtual courses for club activities.
