EXPLORER AWARDS

- Receive points for controls found at specified events
- Badges (BSOA) and certificates awarded when certain totals are reached (10, 25, 50, 75, 100)

Following a model created by DVO. Requires creation of a spreadsheet and ongoing monitoring scores at events (which we update and add to the website regularly).

Very good at encouraging repeated participation - juniors are keen to earn points and work towards the next badge.

BSOA badges are great and cost only 50p each!

Badges stop at 100. We designed our own certificates to continue the programme.

COLOUR SKILLS AWARDS

- White, Yellow and Orange skills booklets available.
- Work on and demonstrate specific orienteering skills at activities and events to sign them off.

Created with the support of materials from SBOC (Seren Awards) - ours is a simplified version.

Juniors can choose the booklet appropriate to them as a starting point.

Will work best alongside coaching and small group sessions where adults are able to have discussions with the junior and observe the named skills.

Parents will also be able to help their child focus on specific skills at events.
